After School Club runs from 3:20-5:00pm and costs £7.50

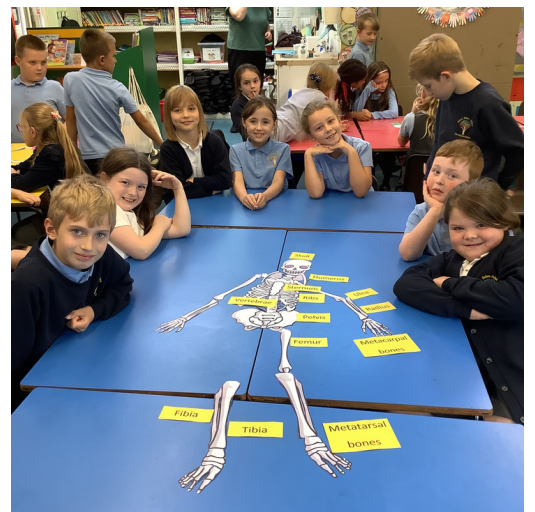
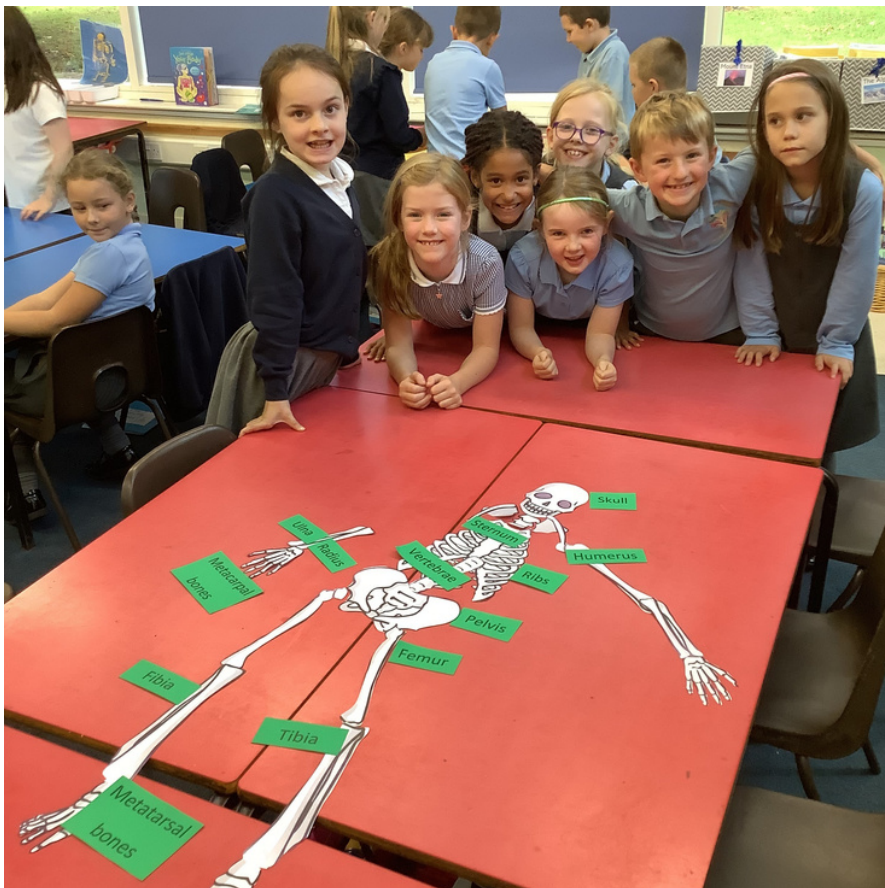
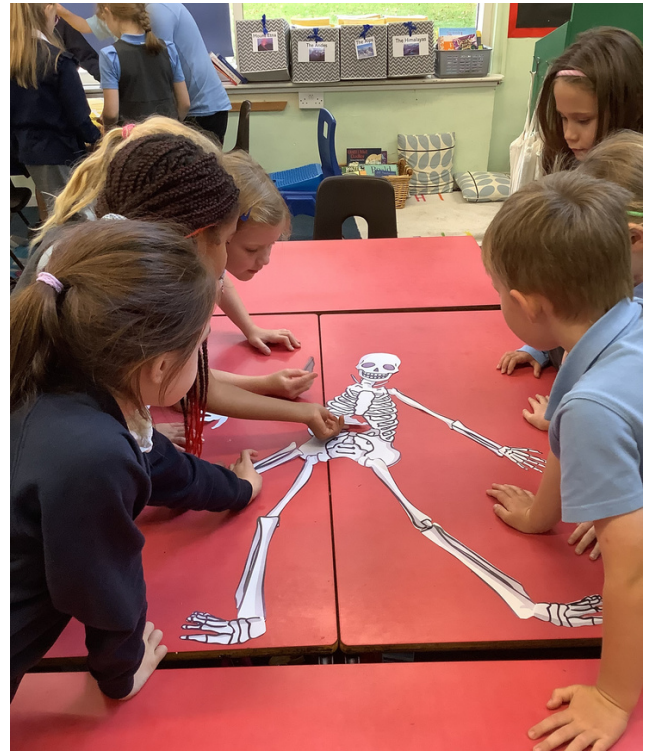
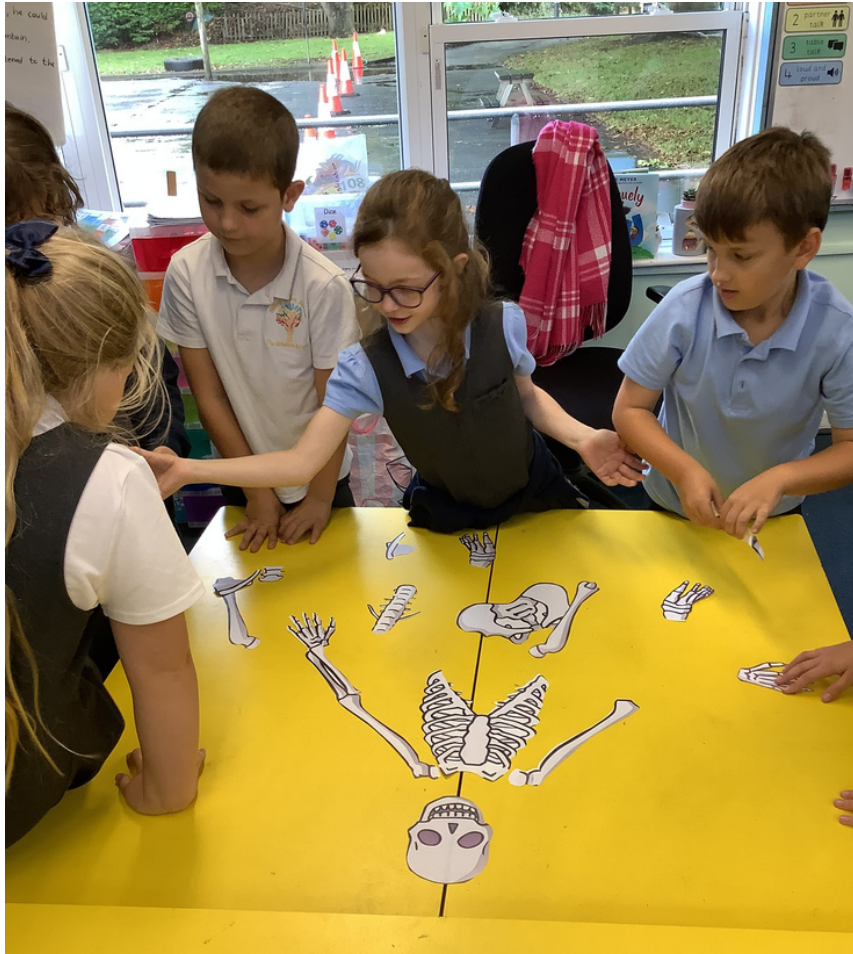
